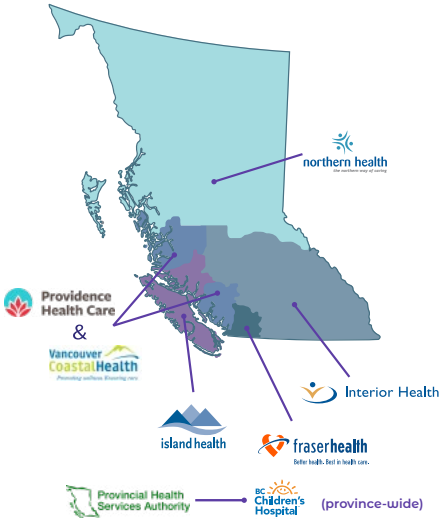


Thanks to early identification and intervention – two areas in which BC Renal leads the country – the growth in BC’s dialysis population has averaged a very low 2% per year over the past decade.

In partnership with BC’s regional health authority renal programs, BC Renal funds, plans and coordinates:

- 16** chronic kidney disease clinics
- 13** peritoneal dialysis clinics
- 12** independent hemodialysis clinics
- 13** hospital dialysis units
- 29** community dialysis units
