If a team-based model, care may be shared with a non-HD trained nurse(s), with the HD trained nurse(s) providing all HD- specific care.	Nursing care is provided in a team- based model . Responsibility for patients is shared with an HD trained nurse(s) who provides all HD-specific care.	Nursing care is provided in a functional team-based model . An HD-trained nurse(s) assumes overall responsibility for the care. Each member of the team is assigned aspects of care that are within their scope & competency. Staff can only perform activities for which they have been trained in post-secondary school, and if authorized by the unit.
Activities (examples)	All activities under Non-HD trained nurse PLUS: HD-specific care including: • Sets up HD machine • Puts patients on HD, takes off HD • Cannulates AVF/AVG • Accesses CVC, caps off CVC • Administers alteplase • Changes CVC dressing • Takes action on HD machine alarms • Transonic measurements • Disinfects HD machines	 All activities under Non-HD trained staff column PLUS: Care of patients before, during and after dialysis: Head to toe assessment Non-HD-specific nursing care (e.g., oxygen support, glucometers) Medications (PO, SQ and IM) Second checker for IV antibiotics / infusions/narcotics/blood products Drainage tube care Pain & symptom assessment & management 	 Before dialysis: Infectious disease screening (e.g., COVID-19, influenza) Weighs patient and records findings Settles patient Takes and records vital signs (if training complete & unit policy permits) Ensures access to call bell During dialysis: Basic care (hygiene)/toileting Patient comforts (e.g., blanket, pillow, adjust bed, ice chips)

	 Monitors and supports challenging behaviors Monitors patients before, during and after dialysis (e.g., visual checks, vital signs, safety monitoring, bleeding from access, etc). Other: Prepares blood work tubes, assists with identification/labelling Prepares supplies for HD, with guidance (e.g., take-off trays) Bed space safety checks e.g., O2 flow meters; suction, emergency cart Chart checks 	 Takes and records vital signs (if training complete) Responds to patient call bells Alerts HD nurse to machine alarms/changes in patient's condition/safety issues Anticipates portering needs and prepares/ assists with transfer Prepares HD take-off supplies (this will be discussed with the HD nurse) After dialysis: Holds sites once needles are removed, applies dressing Weighs patient and records findings Takes and records vital signs (if training complete) Assists with porting patient, if needed If applicable, cleans and disinfects HD station post HD (e.g., wipe down bed, table, non-HD equipment) Other: Makes patient transport arrangements (e.g., HandyDART, call family members for pick-up) Answers telephones Assists with workflow/supply stocking Pulls charts, sets up tables for next shift Assists in moving chairs/beds, HD machines when needed
