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COVID-19 vaccine timing Information for chronic kidney disease and dialysis patients

When will I be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine?

The BC government has developed a phased COVID-19 immunization plan. Below are key dates that will apply to patients with advanced kidney disease and those on dialysis.

Phase and Timeline	Who is eligible
Phase 2: February – April 2021	 <u>All</u> seniors born in 1941 or earlier Indigenous (First Nations, Métis and Inuit) peoples born in 1956 or earlier
Phase 3: April – June 2021	 All people aged 79 to 60 in 5 year increments People aged 69 to 16 who: Are on dialysis – hemodialysis, home hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis Have advanced kidney disease (CKD stage 5, eGFR <15) Are on immunosuppressive medications for kidney disease (regardless of eGFR)
Phase 4: July – September 2021	 People aged 59 to 18 in 5-year increments (if not included in Phase 3)

Do I need to do anything?

When you are eligible for the vaccine (as per the phases and timelines above), you will need to book an appointment through a vaccination call centre. <u>You will not be contacted directly.</u>
