Bleeding Fistula or Graft: What To Do



- It is rare for your fistula or graft to bleed after you leave the dialysis unit.
- This brochure tells you what to do if it does happen.

What supplies do I need in case my needle sites bleed at home?


- Gauze pads
- Tape
- Gloves

Keep these supplies in your emergency kit.

What do I do if my needle sites start to bleed after I leave the dialysis unit?

- 1. Stay calm!
- 2. Place firm pressure on the needle sites:
 - Use gauze, clean cloth, tissue or paper towel.
 - Press the sites with two fingers for 15 minutes.
 - Hold the bleeding arm above the heart.
- 3. Call for help from somewhere nearby!
- If the bleeding stops, apply a band aid. Let your nurse know about the bleeding the next time you are at dialysis.
- 5. If the bleeding does not stop, call 911.
