When to Refer to Social Work



SAFETY/RISK **DISTRESS Codes/Critical Events**

- Child Protection (suspected physical, sexual, or emotional maltreatment)
- Child Welfare Alerts
- Vulnerability due to Life Stage and Social Situation (Child & Youth)
- Vulnerability due to Cognitive/Physical Deficits; and Abuse, Neglect/Self-Neglect (Adult Guardianship)
- High Risk Behaviours
- Harm to Self &/or Others
- Depression and Suicidal Ideation/Attempts
- **Unsafe Environments**
- Violence in Relationships
- **Human Trafficking**
- Substance Misuse &/or Abuse
- Concurrent Disorders Mental Health and Substance Use with Safety/Risk Challenges
- Homelessness associated with Safety/Risk, Harm to Self /Others
- Complex Legal/Ethical issues

- Crisis Intervention/Traumatic Event (includes assault, significant injury/change in health status or unexpected medical outcomes)
- Death & Bereavement (Adult/Child including miscarriages, still birth, etc)
- Treatment Decisions/Quality of Life discussions, including End of Life
- Advance Care Planning
- Adjustments & Transitions (i.e. pre & post diagnosis, treatment trauma, critical illness, life altering prognosis, significant change in function or lifestyle,
- Anxiety or other Mental Health Concerns
- Isolation / Limited Support Network
- Family Systems Challenges (i.e. roles, relationships, conflicts, parenting concerns, separation/divorce, grief & loss, etc)
- Caregiver Responsibility Challenges (Adult &/or Child)

SYSTEMS NAVIGATION

- Complex Situations Requiring Enhanced Communication/Planning (i.e. collaborative care planning conferences)
- Barriers to Transition Planning or Accessing Necessary Resources
- Engaging Individuals/Families for Issues of Participation/Compliance with Treatment
- Coordinating Legal Processes (Adoption, Surrogacy, Temporary Substitute Decision Maker, etc)
- Managing Chronic Conditions (ABI, ALS, COPD, CVA, Diabetes, MH, MS, Renal, etc)
- Individuals/Families with Frequent Hospital Contacts &/or Multiple Service Providers
- Clinical Pathways
- Advocacy & Promoting Self-Advocacy
- Barriers Associated with Social Determinants of Health (i.e. social status, culture, language, education, poverty, etc)

PRACTICAL CONCERNS

- Transition Planning/Continuity of Care
- Eligibility for Various Services/Benefits (ICBC, Veterans Affairs, Work Safe BC etc)
- Housing Resources (tenancy issues, shelters, boarding homes, mental health facility, etc)
- Financial Concerns (accessing income supports, medical coverage or difficulty managing financial matters)
- Transportation
- Legal Assistance Education
- Immigration (sponsorship breakdown, illegal immigrant, visitor, etc)
- Cultural Connections (interpretation arrangements, links to cultural/spiritual community)
- Linking/Referrals &/or Community Resource Education (i.e. Public Health, food/meal programs, private pay resources, Detox or treatment for substance use, etc.)



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
