- Project initiated at Nephrology Days 2007
- Established a provincial planning committee with representation from each Health Authority
- Developed a Project Charter
- Assisted the development of region specific Renal response plans
- Progressed towards a BCPRA Provincial Emergency Management & Business Continuity Plan
- Monthly teleconference meetings
- Face to face meeting October 2, 2008



Project Charter

Mandate

- ✓ Determine the role, scope and function of a Provincial Renal Emergency Management and Business Continuity Plan.
- ✓ Assist the individual BC Renal Programs to develop emergency management and business continuity plans.



Project Charter

Objectives

- √ Form a project team
- ✓ Adopt an organizational structure for a PREMBC Plan.
- ✓ Define the criteria for when and how the Plan will be utilized.
- ✓ Develop a provincial agreement.
- ✓ Explore the need and required processes for accessing emergency support from outside BC.
- ✓ Assist each Health Authority Renal Program to develop a region specific plan.
- ✓ Recommend a method for meeting the ongoing needs.
- ✓ Encourage a training and exercise schedule.
- ✓ Provide a forum to share effective renal emergency strategies and tactics.
- ✓ Standardize information for patient, staff, physicians, etc.



Health Authority Progress

- BCCH planning is underway focusing on the special needs of their patients.
- Fraser Health is in final draft for their EM&BC renal plans and have plans in place for education roll out
- Interior Health has a draft plan along with a gap analysis and recommendations.
- Northern Health has a draft plan that is being reviewed by the Renal Program.
- Vancouver Coastal/ Providence Health are in the final draft stage and are working on how best to integrate their plans.
- Vancouver Island Health has a renal plan that has been shared. Focus over the last year has been on education of patients and staff.




Progress On Provincial Plan

- Agreed to a role for provincial plan.
- Agreed that provincial plan would be initiated from the Health Authority level.
- Agreed that organizational structure used for provincial emergency response would follow the standard Incident Command System approach.
- Looking to PROMIS to house emergency response information.
- Template for provincial plan document has been drafted.

Next Steps For Project

- ✓ Finalize the Provincial Renal Plan document.
- ✓ Development of disaster scenarios for table top exercises that will provide learning and identify gaps in planning
- ✓ Decision making regarding the role and responsibilities of BCPRA and PHSA in the event of disaster
- ✓ Planning for education and training
- Planning to provide continued monitoring and development of the system
- ✓ Develop in collaboration with BCPRA, PHSA and MOHS, interprovincial and cross border agreements for renal care in disaster.




On-Going Needs
