

With compassion, collaboration, and innovation, we will save lives and offer hope through organ donation, transplantation, and research.




BC Transplant – A Renewed Focus

- Increased availability of organs for transplant
- Reduce # of patients on waitlist
- Collaboration, provincial relationships
- Improve how we deliver healthcare to patients.

Partnerships:

BCPRA-BCT Interagency Partnership

Fully integrated model of care for CKD patients – a first in the world!

- Best practice clinical pathways, pre and post transplant (funding model work underway)
- PROMIS integration
- This joint conference

To serve as model for partnership with Cardiac Services



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Revised Medical Structure:

- Clinician as Provincial Executive Director
- Critical Care focus added
- Program focus one medical lead for each program
- Provincial Transplant Program Leader Renal Transplant
 - Dr David Landsberg
 - One program two sites St Paul's & VGH
 - 9 post-transplant follow up clinics



Investment in donation programs:

Living donation programs (pre-assessment resources)

Supported by cost savings achieved through restructuring


Deceased donation programs

- Establish 5 new regional hospital-based critical care teams
 - Three teams in 2011
 - Kelowna General
 - Royal Columbian
 - Vancouver General
