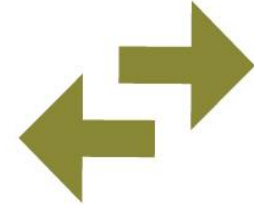

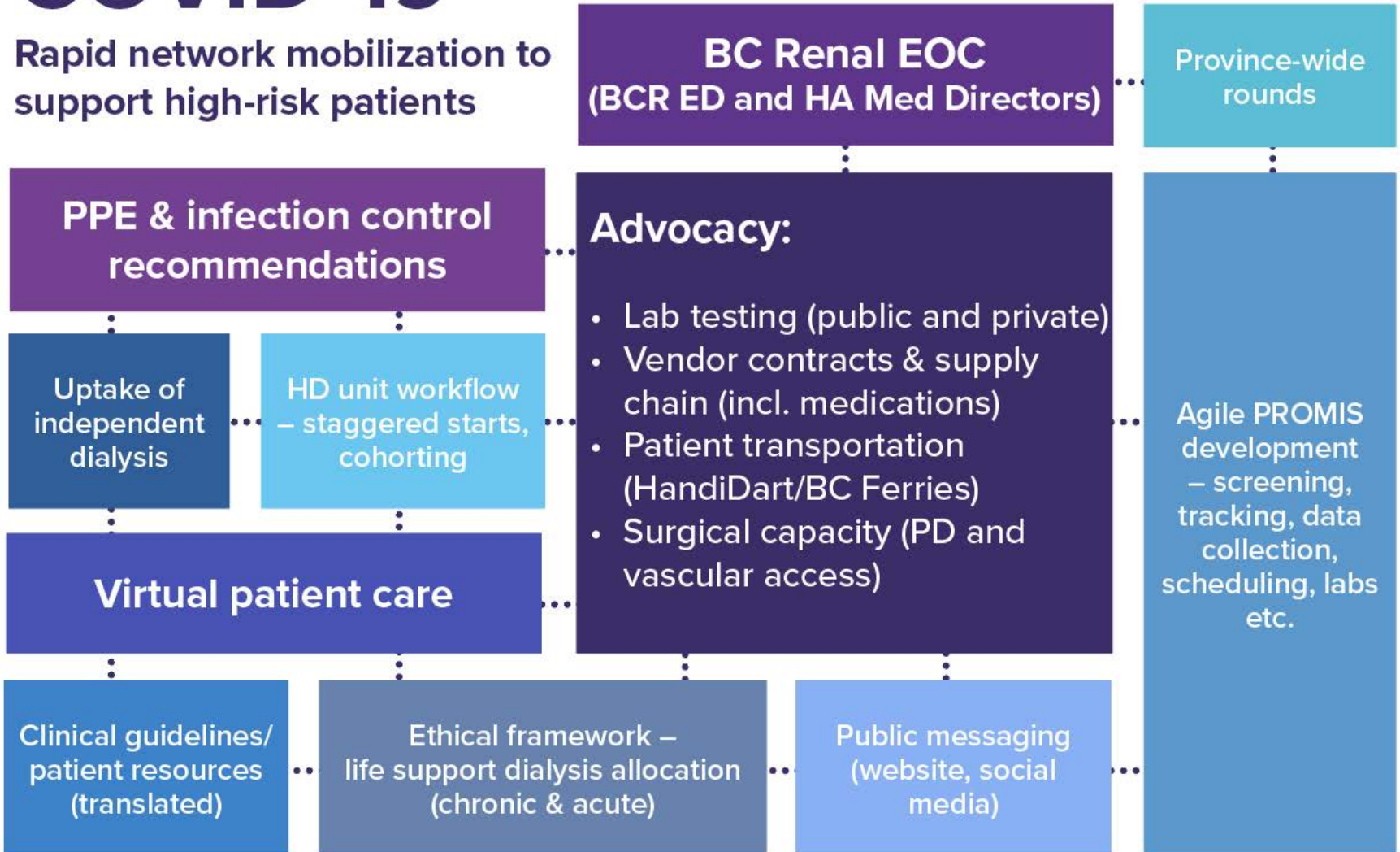

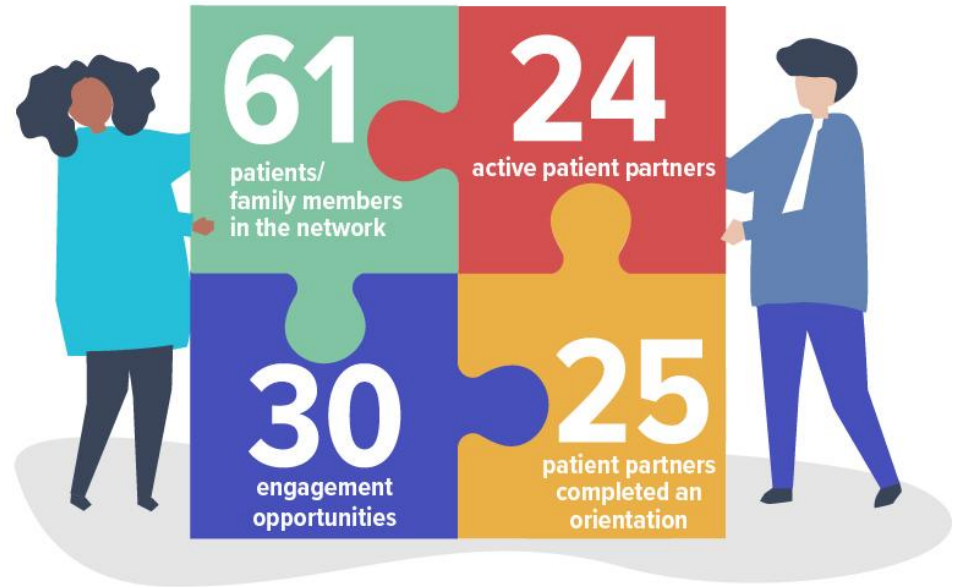









# Optimal Patient Experience and Outcomes

#### Are your kidneys healthy?

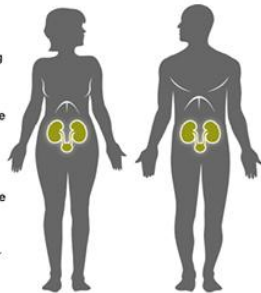
People can have kidney disease without being aware of it.

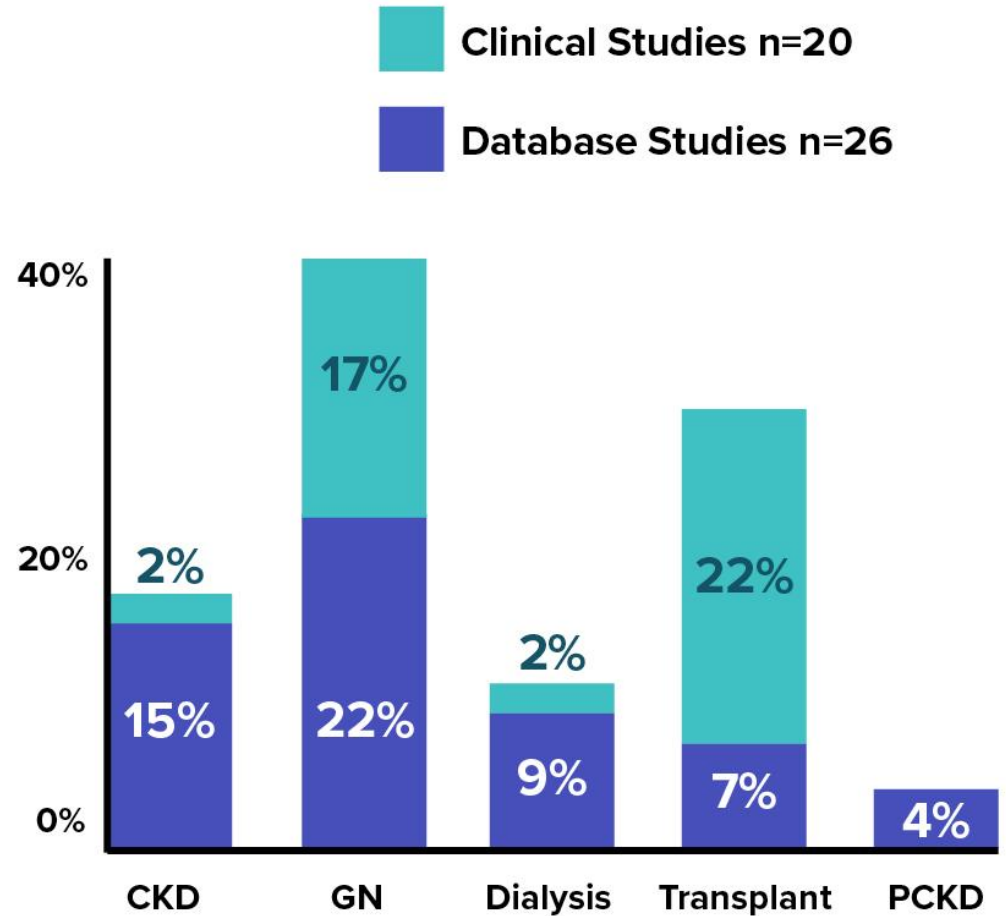
